ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER RE: GRANTING EMERGENCY RELIEF DUE TO SEVERE WEATHER CONDITIONS RESULTING IN THE CLOSURE OF EL DORADO COUNTY SUPERIOR COURT LOCATIONS

Effective this date, pursuant to authorization granted on December 30, 2021, by Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the California Judicial Council ("Chief Justice") issued in response to the December 29, 2021 request for an emergency order made by the Superior Court of El Dorado County ("Court"), the Court HEARBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. It is declared that December 27, 2021, to December 30, 2021, inclusive, be deemed holidays for purposes of computing time under Penal Code section 825, if the emergency conditions described below prevent the Court from conducting proceedings as necessary to satisfy these deadlines on those dates (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(5));
- 2. Any judge of the Court may extend by not more than 21 days the duration of any temporary restraining order that would otherwise expire on December 27, 2021, to December 30, 2021, inclusive, because the emergency condition described below prevented the Court from conducting proceedings to determine whether a permanent order should be entered (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(7)); and
- 3. In cases in which the statutory deadline would otherwise expire on December 27, 2021, to December 30, 2021, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in section 859b of the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination from 10 court days to not more than 15 court days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(9)).

This order is made because of adverse weather conditions causing widespread power outages, road closures and courthouse closures.

The attached order of the Chief Justice and the Court's General Order are incorporated as part of this Administrative Order.

GENERAL ORDER RE: IMPLEMENTATION OF EMERGENCY RELIEF AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 68115 BY CHAIR OF JUDICIAL COUNCIL

Exercising the authority granted under Government Code section 68115 and the December 30, 2021 Order ("Order") of Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the Judicial Council of California, issued in response to the December 29, 2021 request for an emergency order made by the Superior Court of El Dorado County ("Court"), this Court HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. It is declared that December 27, 2021, to December 30, 2021, inclusive, be deemed holidays for purposes of computing time under Penal Code section 825, if the emergency conditions described in the Order prevent the Court from conducting proceedings as necessary to satisfy these deadlines on those dates (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(5));
- 2. Any judge of the Court may extend by not more than 21 days the duration of any temporary restraining order that would otherwise expire on December 27, 2021, to December 30, 2021, inclusive, because the emergency condition described in the Order prevented the Court from conducting proceedings to determine whether a permanent order should be entered (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(7)); and
- 3. In cases in which the statutory deadline would otherwise expire on December 27, 2021, to December 30, 2021, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in section 859b of the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination from 10 court days to not more than 15 court days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(9)).

THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Because of adverse weather conditions causing widespread power outages, road closures, and courthouse closures, it has been determined that the conditions described in section 68115 of the Government Code are met with regard to the Superior Court of California, County of El Dorado. Upon the request of Presiding Judge Suzanne N. Kingsbury, it is ordered that the Superior Court of El Dorado County is authorized to do the following:

- Declare that December 27, 2021, to December 30, 2021, inclusive, be deemed holidays for purposes of computing time under Penal Code section 825, if the above-described emergency conditions prevent the court from conducting proceedings as necessary to satisfy these deadlines on those dates (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(5));
- Extend by not more than 21 days the duration of any temporary restraining order that would otherwise expire on December 27, 2021, to December 30, 2021, inclusive, because the emergency condition described herein prevented the court from conducting proceedings to determine whether a permanent order should be entered (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(7)); and
- Extend the time period provided in section 859b of the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination from 10 court days to not more than 15 court days, applicable only to cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire on December 27, 2021, to December 30, 2021, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(9)).
