PUBLIC NOTICE RE: VIDEOCONFERENCE APPEARANCE IN CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS (August 12, 2022)

The Emergency rule 3: Use of technology for remote appearances adopted by the Judicial Council of California ended June 30, 2022, and Assembly Bill 199 became effective July 1, 2022 thereby authorizing remote criminal proceedings pursuant to Penal Code Sections 977, 977.3 and 1043.5. As such, the Public Notice Re: Videoconference Appearances in Criminal Proceedings dated January 27, 2022 that temporarily suspended Local Rule 5.01.00 is rescinded effective immediately.

Any request for videoconferencing in criminal proceeding for matters on calendar *on or after August 29, 2022*, shall be submitted to the El Dorado County Superior Court (Court) in accordance with Local Rule 5.01.00. To ensure all matters are scheduled for videoconference in a timely manner and that matters are ready to proceed at the designated date and time, an <u>Application for Videoconference Appearance and Order (Local Form M-51)</u> must be submitted to the Court. This form is available at https://eldorado.courts.ca.gov/forms-filing/local-forms.

Note: Under emergency circumstances (e.g., COVID-19 related or sudden injury/illness), the Court may accept requests to appear by Zoom videoconference by contacting the Clerk's Office and/or department in which the matter is scheduled to be heard. The judicial officer will determine whether to approve the emergency request to appear by videoconferencing.
