

**1. MATTER OF BARRAZA, 25CV1422****OSC Re: Name Change**

Before the court is a petition to change the name of a person under 18 years of age. The petition is signed by the mother only. Code of Civil Procedure section 1276, subdivision (c) provides, "In a proceeding for a change of name commenced by the filing of a petition, if the person whose name is proposed to be changed is under 18 years of age and the petition is signed by only one parent, the petition shall specify the address, if known, of the other parent if living." (Code Civ. Proc., § 1276, subd. (c).)

Petitioner submitted a copy of the judgment from El Dorado Superior Court Case Number 23FL0807, finding that Julian Sebala Barraza is not the biological parent of the minor.

Additionally, under Paragraph 7(e) of the name change petition, which asks for both parents' names and addresses, petitioner indicated "N/A" for the father. The court interprets this to mean that the mother does not know the identity of the biological father.

The court notes that petitioner submitted proof of publication, as required under Code of Civil Procedure section 1277, subdivision (a)(2)(A).

**OSC Re: Name Change**

The petition does not specify the reason for the name change. (Code Civ. Proc., § 1276, subd. (a)(2).) Also, to date, there is no proof of publication in the court's file. (Code Civ. Proc., § 1277, subd. (a)(2)(A).)
