Status of Administration

TENTATIVE RULING # 1: THE COURT, ON ITS OWN MOTION AND IN THE INTEREST OF JUDICIAL ECONOMY, CONTINUES THE STATUS OF ADMINISTRATION HEARING TO 8:30 A.M., FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 6, 2026, IN DEPARTMENT FOUR, TO BE HEARD CONCURRENTLY WITH THE PETITION TO ESTABLISH THE ESTATE’S CLAIM OF OWNERSHIP TO PERSONAL PROPERTY AND FOR AN ORDER DIRECTING ITS TRANSFER TO THE ESTATE.

3. ESTATE OF JONES, 25PR0286**Petition for Order to Terminate Trusts and Distribute Assets**

Pursuant to Probate Code section 17200, subdivision (b), petitioners Matthew Jones and Christina Tomolillo – the trustees of two separate trusts at issue, the “Jones Tomo Family Trust” and the “Ozark24 Business Trust” – petition the court to (1) terminate both trusts under Probate Code section 15404, which provides “[a] trust may be modified or terminated by the written consent of the settlor and all beneficiaries without court approval of the modification or termination” (Prob. Code, § 15404, subd. (a)); and (2) order distribution of all assets in both trusts to petitioners in their individual capacities.

The settlor of both trusts is Sarah Jones. Attached to the petition is the settlor’s signed written consent to terminate both trusts, as well as the signed written consent of the trustees and beneficiaries. (Petrn., Exs. H, I, J.)

4. GUARDIANSHIP OF ALEX B., 24PR0240**Annual Review Hearing**

Letters of guardianship of the person were issued on November 1, 2024. The annual guardianship status report (Judicial Council Form GC-251) concerning the minor was submitted by the guardian. Having read and considered the report, the court finds and orders that the guardianship remains necessary and shall continue.

5. CONSERVATORSHIP OF S.P., SMH20190001

Petition to Re-Appoint LPS Conservator of the Person and Estate
